1. **Cecile Thibaut**^{1,2,3,4,5} was born on 23 Dec 1839 in St Louis County, Missouri.⁶ She was baptized on 26 Dec 1839 in St Ferdinand Catholic Church, Florissant, Missouri.⁷ (Image 32 is the index, Image 253 is the baptism record) She died on 18 Nov 1915 at the age of 75 in 5012 Bulver Ave, St Louis, Missouri.^{8,9} Cecile was buried on 22 Nov 1915 in St Ferdinand Cemetery, Florissant, Missouri, N.E. Sect 5 Lot 4.^{10,11} (Image 1031) Link to parents: Baptism record names parents Francois Thibault and Marguerite Montreuil.

NOTES

Cecile married Antoine Overy on 5 February 1859 in St. Ferdinand Church, Florissant, Missouri. (Film 008119510 on FamilySearch, Image 846)

The 1910 census shows Cecilia Overy living with her cousin, Peter Hubert. She says she has eight children, all living. (Date on this record is 23 April 1910, residence is Margaretta Avenue, St Louis City.) She is also shown with her son, George, on 26 April, residence is South Broadway, St Louis City. In that record she says she has had eight children, three of whom are living.

A note on the burial record says she was interred "in the lot of Ant. Overy" in St Ferdinand's Cemetery.

The death certificate is confusing. Her son George was the informant and in answer to the questions about the deceased's father and mother, he gave information about his own father and mother. So the record says that her parents were Anton Overy and Cecelia Theubo!
